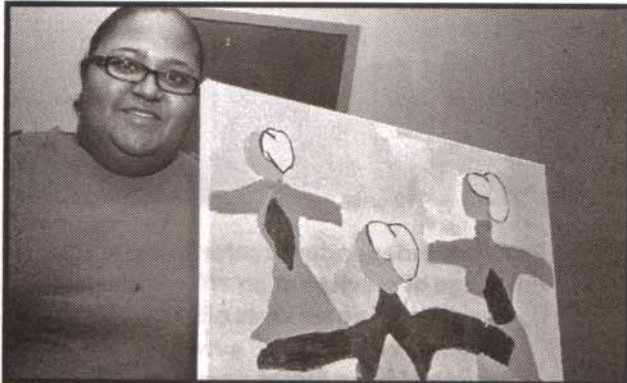


Shades of Decatur

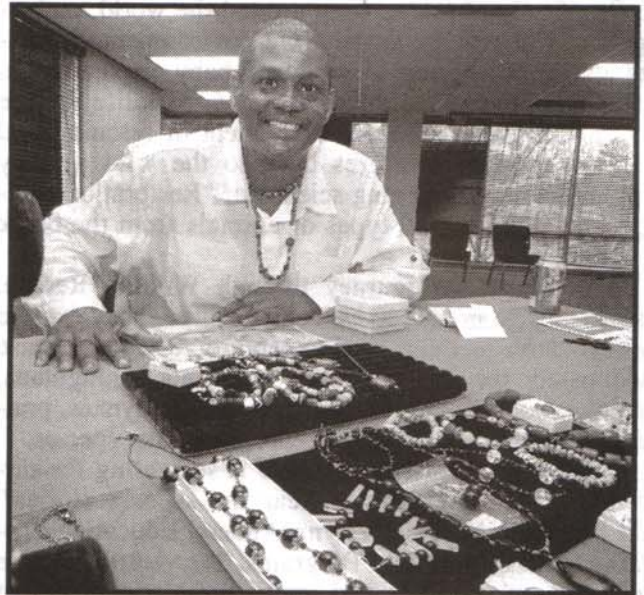
